As I write this there is thunder, lightning and rain outside. Our summer here has been drier than we would like. I think of what a blessing rain is. Rain is promised to those who obey the Lord: "If you diligently obey the voice of the Lord your God... The LORD will open to you His good treasure, the heavens, to give the rain to your land in its season, and to bless all the work of your hand" (Deuteronomy 28:1,12).

The rain that pours down from heaven is like the truth that flows out of the Lord's Word: "the reason why 'raining' means a blessing is that as rain comes down from heaven or the sky and causes the land to be productive, so Divine Goodness and Truth come down from heaven to a person and cause him to be blessed" (Secrets of Heaven 8416). The Lord said something similar through Moses: "Let my teaching drop as the rain, My speech distill as the dew, As raindrops on the tender herb, And as showers on the grass" (Deuteronomy 32.2).

How many things grow and flourish when they have enough water! It is the same with the church when we accept and understand the truth the Lord gives us. Reading the Word daily is like watering your plants. Only a few days of a dry spell and the plants and whither and die. A little water every day makes them lush and green. If we only read the Word a little bit each day and are willing to practice the truths we have, then the Lord will send insights, along with peace, hope and comfort that will help us flourish and produce much fruit.

If as a congregation we turn to the Word and are willing to obey the Lord's commands, we will find as many good ideas and intentions growing in our hearts as there are trees and shrubs in our environment. If we are willing to obey the Lord, He will give us doctrine like rain, and the peace and growth of the church will follow in due season.

"For as the rain comes down, and the snow from heaven, And do not return there, But water the earth, And make it bring forth and bud, That it may give seed to the sower And bread to the eater, So shall My word be that goes forth from My mouth; It shall not return to Me void, But it shall accomplish what I please, And it shall prosper *in the thing* for which I sent it" (Isaiah 55:10-11).

#### BRYN ATHYN CEMETERY MEETING UPDATE

On Monday, August 9, 2010 we held our first town forum at Cairnwood Village to start the process of reviewing the rules and regulations of the Bryn Athyn Cemetery that were approved by the Bryn Athyn Church Trustees on February 18, 1974. Approximately 35 people attended the meeting. The purpose of this series of town forums is to review all of our Cemetery policies and update them as necessary.

We reviewed the rules and regulations and also outlined the following items that will be reviewed by a volunteer committee that will obtain input from our community. The committee will then develop suggested changes or additions to our current regulations that can be reviewed and voted on by our Board of Trustees.

- Expansion of area available for gravesites
- Replacement of trees
- Reservations of places for spouses of deceased married partners
- Headstone guidelines / restrictions
- Maintenance of gravesite plantings
- Temporary gravesite decorations
- Possibility of a future memorial wall that will fit into the natural landscape
- Record-keeping
- Volunteer opportunities
- Updating our current funeral brochure to include contact information and estimated costs

Additional ideas for discussion that were brought up during the meeting or received via e-mail are as follows:

A hand-out for families that explains our policies and rules

- Ash burials - Are there areas in the cemetery that we aren't able to use for full-size casket burials that could be utilized for ash burials?
- Is there a location where people can look at plot plans?
- Gravesite decorations - time frame - who enforces rules?
- Please keep the graveyard in its natural landscape setting
- Arches or gates to define the entrance to the cemetery

**Sermon Review****THE CHALLENGED LIFE**

Fairy tale heroes face difficult challenges: dragons, giants, witches, dungeons and dark forests. If they overcome, they find peace, happiness and true love and live happily ever after. In real life the trials seldom end with a wedding. Most of us face many challenges throughout our lives, some that we might undertake willingly, and others we wish desperately to avoid. Chronic, debilitating disease; constant pain; physical handicaps; mental illness; families destroyed by addiction, adultery and abuse; poverty, homelessness, joblessness; painful conflicts in families, in the community and on the job. Life is filled with challenges.

The Word too is filled with challenges: the snake tempted Adam and Eve to eat from the tree of knowledge, Noah survived the flood, the Israelites were slaves in Egypt, David fought Goliath, Daniel was in a lion's den, Jesus was crucified. The Teachings for the New Church show us that these stories actually describe challenges to our spiritual life. You may often find the word "temptation" used to translate the Latin *tentatio* which actually means a trial, test or challenge.

King David in particular experienced many challenges: lions, bears, Goliath and other enemies of Israel. He spent years as a fugitive from Saul. It was through those challenges that David became the great king that he was. Each challenge prepared him for the next. And on a deeper level his story and his Psalms are about our challenges and the Lord's struggles against the hells.

When Jesus saw a man blind from birth, the disciples asked, "Who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?"

Jesus answered, "Neither this man nor his parents, but that the works of God should be revealed in him." The disciples were thinking of the blindness as a punishment, and looking to the past to discover who to blame. But the Lord was looking to the future, and saw the blindness as an opportunity for transformation.

Not all challenges are spiritual in nature. When our love for the Lord and for others is challenged by resentments, anger, lust, doubts, worries or other evils, it is a spiritual temptation or trial. When our love for pleasure, possessions and power is challenged, it is a worldly trial that may not advance our spiritual life. Sometimes we are challenged on both levels at the same time.

Through struggling with evils we learn to detest them. The longer we resist, the stronger our resistance becomes and the greater our dislike of them. Our trials also strengthen our ability to love others, because we are fighting for our love for them, and in our trials we often have to practice forgiveness and repentance. We also come closer to the Lord through our challenges when we reach point of despair and realize how much we need His help. Though He may seem absent, He is close then than at other times.

And finally, there really is a happily-ever-after. We may experience glimpses of it in this life, but the Lord gives eternal joy and happiness to those who overcome in spiritual trials. (JLO)
